

#### WCIRB'S 2020 STATE OF THE SYSTEM REPORT



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
- The WCIRB stated "since 2012, indemnity claims closed more quickly, in part attributable to SB 863 provisions related to liens, IMR, independent bill review, reduced opioid use and a reduced number of spinal surgeries."
- Liens have decreased, however the number of "California indemnity claims open at 60 months is almost three times the median state, despite a recent acceleration in claim closure rates" This is in part to the high volume of liens filed.

## WCIRB LIEN REPORTING

According to the WCIRB the share of payments for medical liens decreased significantly over the last five years.

"The shares of medical costs in other categories remained relatively consistent over the last five years."

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



- According to the WCIRB 38%\* of open indemnity claims closed within 12 months in 2019.
   This was the highest rate of claim closing since the mid 1990s.

- EN BANC No 5. The Appeals Board rescinded its suspension of WCAB Rules 10755, 10756 and 10888 effective 10/27/2020
  - As of 10/27/2020 Notices of Intent to Dismiss Lien Claimant for Failure to Appear can be requested / Orders of Dismissal Granted if objection not received timely.
- EN BANC No 6. The Appeals Board rescinded its suspension of WCAB Rules 10620 and 10670(b)(3):
  - As of 12/1/20, we are required to file all trial documents within 20 days of the trial date.

#### LIEN LITIGATION – COVID-19 DELAYS

- New Lien Conferences are being set March-May 2021:
  - VNO, OXN, and LAO are being set as late as May 2021
- Existing Lien Conferences/Trials rescheduled at random:
  - Rescheduled Lien Conferences/Trials are being moved to as late as August 2021
  - Lien Conferences/Trials are being rescheduled up to the day before the hearing
- LBO, MDR, and LAO advised they are continuing Lien Conferences/Trials to Oxnard if EDD is not an issue
- OXN is rescheduling Lien Conferences/Trials to June-August 2021

#### LIEN LITIGATION – TIPS FOR EFFICIENT LITIGATION



- Preparation is key!
  - Utilize the WCAB <u>Court Calendar</u> to confirm your Lien Conference is one of the "three per session"
  - Contact all parties and confirm telephonic appearance
  - Confirm all parties received discovery
  - Come to an agreed upon disposition
    - OTOC
    - Continuance
    - Set for Lien Trial
  - Pre-fill the PTCS via email with all parties included
  - Most Lien Trials are being continued





Outweigh the cost of continued delays in litigation vs resolving the lien

Lien Trials can be complex and will be difficult to complete in the current format

#### LIEN RESOLUTION TIPS — FATAL FLAWS

#### **FRAUD**

- SB 1160 STAYS ANY LIEN UPON THE FILING OF CRIMINAL CHARGES
- SB 1160 ALLOWS FOR SUSPENSION OF FRAUDLANT PROVIDERS FROM WC SYSTEM
- SUSPECTED FRAUD IS NOT THE SAME!

#### **DEFECTIVE LIEN FILING**

- 4903.8 (d) Party signs under penalty of perjury that services/products billed were actually provided and that the billing submitted is true and accurate
- 10550 (d) Proper Identification of the Parties and Lien Claimants – Assignment should be disclosed and a copy of assignment filed
- 10770.5 Verification to Filing Lien Claim
- 4903.05 (c) For all liens filed on or after 1/1/17

#### STANDING

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Party without a valid Assignment
   Provider of Service is not the Lien Claimant
- FTB Status Suspended Can't collect from the date their Business License is suspended
- Licensing They must have been licensed at time of service under their Professional Industry (Medical, Pharmacy, Laboratory, etc.)

#### LIEN RESOLUTION TIPS — FRAUD

Labor Code section 4615 places an automatic stay on liens filed by or on behalf of physicians and providers who are criminally charged with certain types of fraud. The automatic stay prevents those liens from being litigated or paid while the prosecution is pending. Not all providers charged with fraud are marked 4615 in EAMS.

Amir Friedman, 54, an anesthesiologist, of Calabasas, California, was charged for his alleged participation in a conspiracy to commit honest services mail and wire fraud and Travel Act violations involving approximately \$800,000 in kickbacks for compounded pharmaceutical drugs involving New Age Pharmaceuticals, Inc.

#### LIENS WITH THRESHOLD ISSUES

RECENTLY FILED LIENS WHERE A VALID ISSUE ARISES, AND LIEN CLAIMANTS WON'T RESOLVE FOR A REASONABLE AMOUNT.

### EXPLANATION OF REVIEWS - LABOR CODE 4603.2. – EFFECTIVE 1/1/2017

- Payment "shall be made at reasonable maximum amounts in the official medical fee schedule, pursuant to Section 5307. I, in effect on the date of service.
- Payments shall be made by the employer with an explanation of review pursuant to Section 4603.3 within 45 days (60 days if government entity) after receipt of each separate itemization of medical services provided, together with any required reports and any written authorization for services that may have been received by the physician.
- IF YOU ARE NOT GOING TO PAY THE BILL the physician shall be notified, in the explanation of review, that the itemization is contested, denied, or considered incomplete, within 30 days after receipt of the itemization by the employer.
- Sending timely compliant EOR's is critical in defending liens that are subject to SBR/IBR and protect you against any potential P&I allegations.

## LABOR CODE 4603.3 - EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2013 - REQUIRMENTS OF AN EXPLANATION OF REVIEW

- (a) Upon payment, adjustment, or denial of a complete or incomplete itemization of medical services, an employer shall provide an explanation of review in the manner prescribed by the administrative director that shall include all of the following:
- (I) A statement of the items or procedures billed and the amounts requested by the provider to be paid.
- (2) The amount paid.
- (3) The basis for any adjustment, change, or denial of the item or procedure billed.
- (4) The additional information required to make a decision for an incomplete itemization.
- (5) If a denial of payment is for some reason other than a fee dispute, the reason for the denial.
- (6) Information on whom to contact on behalf of the employer if a dispute arises over the payment of the billing. The explanation of review shall inform the medical provider of the time limit to raise any objection regarding the items or procedures paid or disputed and how to obtain an independent review of the medical bill pursuant to Section 4603.6.
- (b) The administrative director may adopt regulations requiring the use of electronic explanations of review.

## SECTION § 9792.5.5. SECOND REVIEW OF MEDICAL TREATMENT BILL OR MEDICAL-LEGAL BILL

■ The provider must submit a Request for Second Bill Review within 90 days of the <u>Date of Service</u> of the Explanation of Review

#### Definition of Date of Service (depends on how the EOR was sent out)

- Date of Service = Proof of Service only IF a proof of service is sent with the EOR
- Date of Service = Receipt of EOR by provider only IF a proof of service is not sent with EOR AND Claims Administrator has proof of receipt.
- Date of Service = 5 days from mailing of the EOR only IF the EOR was sent by mail without a POS. The Date of service would be (5) calendar days from USPS postmark stamped on the envelope in which the EOR was mailed.
- Date of Service = Date of an order from WCAB resolving any threshold issues, if one exists

#### KEY DECISION – SBR/IBR

 MEADOWBROOK INSURANCE COMPANY, Petitioner, v. WORKERS' COMPENSATION APPEALS BOARD and DFS INTERPRETING et al., Respondents.

3<sup>RD</sup> DCA finds applicable Interpreter Fee Schedule and dismissed the lien of DFS Interpreting. DFS Interpreting sought payment from Meadowbrook Insurance Company. The carrier issued Explanations of Review with their payments. DFS objected to the Explanation of Reviews BUT failed to request a second bill review as required under Labor Code 4603.2(e)(2).

#### Importance of this decision

The California State Court is higher than the WCAB trial courts and higher than the Work Comp Appeals Board. A California State Court decision has greater weight than a Work Comp Appeals Board En Banc Decision. The California State Court's decision is now the law of the land and all lien claimants must comply with the SBR process.

KEY DECISION – MEADOWBROOK INSURANCE COMPANY, PETITIONER, V. WORKERS' COMPENSATION APPEALS BOARD AND DFS INTERPRETING ET AL., RESPONDENTS.

LABOR CODE 4603.2(E)(1).

"(e)(1) If the provider disputes the amount paid, the provider may request a second review within 90 days of service of the explanation of review or an order of the appeals board resolving the threshold issue as stated in the explanation of review pursuant to paragraph (5) of subdivision (a) of Section 4603.3. The request for a second review shall be submitted to the employer on a form prescribed by the administrative director and

#### KEY DECISION – ESTABLISHED INTERPRETING OMFS

The MEADOWBROOK decision ALSO established that there is an "adopted" fee schedule for Interpreting Services:

This argument applies to all partially paid Interpreter liens; the fee schedule can be found under §9795.3.

§9795.3. Fees for Interpreter Services should be billed and paid at the following rates:

#### Legal Interpreting:

- (i) at the rate for one-half day or one full day as set forth in the Superior Court fee schedule for interpreters in the county where the service was provided, or
- (ii) (ii) at the market rate."

#### **Medical Treatment:**

\$11.25 per quarter hour or portion thereof, with a minimum payment of two hours, or the market rate, whichever is greater.

#### MARKET RATE FURTHER ANALYSIS

Definition of "Market Rate" as defined in 8 CCR §9795.1:

"Market rate" means that amount an interpreter has actually been paid for recent interpreter services provided in connection with the preparation and resolution of an employee's claim. Employees

Payments from TPA's establish market rate. Use Maria Becerra, Applicant v. Slik Apparel if applicable Market Rate analysis based on payments from TPA do NOT establish market rate.

# KEY DECISIONS – INTERPRETING MARKET RATE

Maria Becerra, Applicant v. Slik Apparel, Employers
 Compensation Insurance Company, Defendants, 2019

"WCAB, rescinding WCJ's decision, returned matter to trial level for further proceedings regarding market rate of lien claimant's interpreting services as defined in 8 Cal. Code Reg. § 9795. I (e), when market rate evidence submitted by lien claimant at trial was insufficient to establish market rate because it only included information from accounts which were paid in full by defendants and none where lien claimant accepted less than full payment"



#### MEDICAL LEGAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCESS




- We tend to conflate "medlegal" with "non-IBR."
- They are two separate processes.
- It diverges at the point of Defendant's partial payment vs. nonpayment.

The first opportunity for objection to the petition is as to whether or not the Non-IBR petition is proper on grounds that, either, it is:

- I) not based on medlegal services; or:
- 2) is based on a fee dispute, subject to SBR/IBR.

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#### MEDICAL LEGAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCESS

Failure by provider to follow the timelines and form requirements deems the bill satisfied.

Failure by defendant to follow the timelines and for requirements opens them up to attorney fees, sanctions, and costly litigation.

## KEY DECISIONS – COPY SERVICE

- Colamonico v. Secure Transportation

- It is the Lien Claimants/Petitioners burden to prove their services were reasonable AND necessary
- Defendants' failure to object to bill or send Explanation of Review NO longer waives all defenses
- Defendants can dispute the reasonableness or necessity of a medical-legal expense


We recommend following the dispute process in the previous section; however, this new decision does provide relief to defending against unreasonable services.

#### **OBSTACLES TO FILE CLOSURE**

Here are a few other challenges to closing lien files we encounter on a day-to-day basis:

- Delays due to COVID-19
- Volume of liens decreasing but complexity of liens filed increasing
- Litigious Collection Companies that work off a % instead of reason
- Statute of Limitation Still a Triable issue
- Fee Schedule and IBR Issues
- Difficult WCAB Locations or Judges
- Service of Discovery Medical Provider vs Non-Medical
